2. Share the results of developmental screeners with families using a developmental systems model.
3. Identify and make referrals to the appropriate agency for children and families that need extra support or further evaluation.
4. Implement the practice of routine screening into your professional role or organization.
5. Identify and support protective factors for children and families.
